Aurora on the Park, permanent supportive housing for 25 formerly homeless and vulnerable Calgarians, is now ready to open its doors

Calgary's largest yarn-bombed house was demolished to make room for a fully accessible 25-unit apartment building, thanks to the Government of Alberta, StreetSide Development: A Qualico Company and other generous donors

Calgary, Alberta (November 24, 2016) – The RESOLVE Campaign, home builder StreetSide Developments: A Qualico Company and two RESOLVE Partners, the Calgary Homeless Foundation (CHF) and Calgary Alpha House Society, are celebrating the opening of Aurora on the Park (832 10 Street NW), the third new construction project to be completed through the RESOLVE Campaign.

The issue of homelessness in Calgary is intensified by a critical shortage of affordable and supported housing. Aurora on the Park will provide barrier-free, permanent supportive rental housing for 25 vulnerable and homeless Calgarians. The project was funded by provincial government grants and built by StreetSide Developments: A Qualico Company as part of a "Visionary" gift to the RESOLVE Campaign. In addition to the contributions made by the Government of Alberta and StreetSide Developments: A Qualico Company, Aurora on the Park was made possible by additional generous donors, including: the Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation; David and Leslie Bissett; Ryan and Joella Shoemaker; James Hardie Building Products; and True Exteriors Ltd.

"There is an urgent need in our city for affordable housing with support services. Aurora on the Park is a direct solution for 25 homeless and vulnerable Calgarians who will no longer have to worry about where they will sleep at night," said Deputy Chief Trevor Daroux of the Calgary Police Service, who is also a member of RESOLVE's Calgarians Committed to Change Cabinet as well as Vice-Chair of the Calgary Homeless Foundation. "Aurora on the Park will provide the tenants with safe, stable, affordable and barrier-free housing with the support they need to work towards rebuilding their lives."

The building is located in Hillhurst-SunnySide where there are many convenient amenities like public transportation and other services. The community has been very welcoming since the beginning of the project.

"This partnership of all levels of government, Calgary Home Builders and the RESOLVE Campaign continues to make ending homelessness possible in Calgary. Aurora on the Park represents more than just an accessible home for 25 individuals experiencing homelessness. It represents hope and a better future for them and for all Calgarians," said Diana Krecsy, President and CEO, Calgary Homeless Foundation.

Aurora on the Park is the third building to be completed in a series of purpose-built apartments that will be constructed by Calgary home builders for CHF through the RESOLVE Campaign. Calgary Alpha House Society will provide 24-hour on-site tenant support services under contract to CHF.

"People who are dealing with complex social issues who do not have housing can deteriorate quickly" says Kathy Christiansen, Executive Director of Calgary Alpha House Society. "We are so grateful at Calgary Alpha House Society to provide the support that Aurora on the Park tenants need to be able to heal and reclaim their potential."

Aurora on the Park is ready for the building's future tenants to move in as early as Nov. 25. The supports provided by Calgary Alpha House Society will include: 24-hour double-staffing, controlled entry, recreation therapy and other supports the tenants may need.

"Today we celebrate community and the opening of Aurora on the Park, a new affordable, fully accessible and supported home for 25 Calgarians who were formerly without a home. Every Calgarian deserves a place to call home and we are thrilled to have had the opportunity to be involved in this important initiative," says Glynn Hendry, Regional Vice President, Qualico Developments.

Constructing purpose-built housing for the homeless sector is complex because each individual has a different history and different needs. Aurora on the Park has been designed to promote community building with common rooms, shared dining rooms and meeting rooms.

The 25 tenants at Aurora on the Park will be provided with stability and security as they move from experiencing homelessness to having a place to call home.
